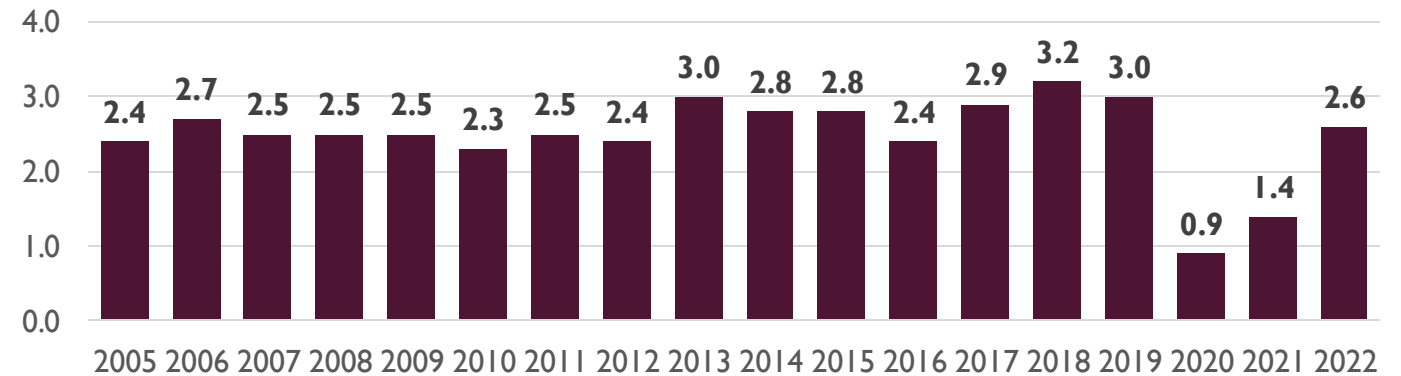
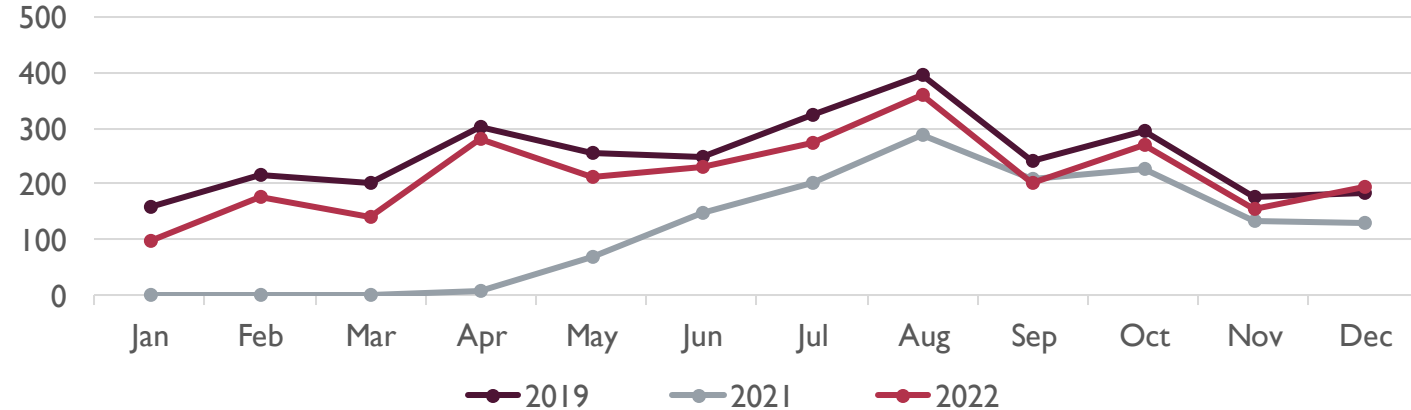


- Visitor attractions in the Visit York Big Attractions Group\* attracted a total of **2,982,155** visitors in 2022
- York's **11 big** attractions welcomed a total of **2,590,403** visitors in 2022
- **York Minster** attracted the highest number of visitors, followed by the National Railway Museum and the JORVIK Viking Centre
- **August** was the busiest month for attractions, followed by April. January was the quietest
- Clifford's Tower was closed for the whole of 2021 while undergoing a £5 million conservation project. Of the remaining attractions, all but one recorded **increased visits** in 2022 vs. 2021
- The number of visits to York's 11 big attractions rose by **83%** in 2022 compared with the year before. However this is still **13%** lower than before the pandemic
- These figures for York's big attractions compare positively with recent figures published by the Association of Leading Visitor Attractions showing an increase of 69% in visits to its sites in 2022, still 23% lower than in 2019

- **2 Outside of York:** Beningbrough Hall, Castle Howard
